



January 2015 Service Changes **Overview/Potential Frequently Asked Questions**

What is the service change effective date?

Monday, January 5, 2015.

What service is changing, and why?

Route and schedule changes are as follows:

Route 5 –Route change to serve F St. between 40th and 48th Sts.; morning weekday trips adjusted to enhance transfers.

Route 8 - Route change to serve 4th St. between Waterman and Palm Aves.; morning weekday trips adjusted to enhance transfers. *(This change occurred on Dec. 1)*

Route 19 – Schedule change only; morning weekday trips adjusted to enhance transfers and accommodate school bell schedules.

Route 81 – Schedule change only; afternoon weekday trips adjusted to enhance transfers.

Route 308/309/310 – Schedule change only; minor adjustments made throughout weekday schedule to enhance transfers.

What is the new Veterans fare?

Omnitrans is introducing Veterans fare in appreciation of the men and women who have served in our armed forces. Veterans will save 50% on cash fare and bus passes.

Veterans fare is the same as Omnitrans' Senior/Disabled fare:

Cash - 75¢ Day Pass - \$2.25 7-Day Pass - \$8.00 31-Day Pass - \$27.50

What are the requirements for Veterans fare eligibility?

To be eligible for Veterans fare, veterans who have been honorably discharged from the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard simply need to show a valid retired Veterans ID card issued by the U.S. Department of Defense and Veterans Affairs, or the County of San Bernardino Department of Veterans Affairs.

How can I get a Veterans ID card?

[Can I use my VA ID card verifying my service-related disability to receive Veterans fare?](#)

No. You likely would be eligible for Omnitrans' Disabled fare discount, which is the same as Veterans fare. I would be happy to send you a disability ID card application if you'd like. If you would prefer to use Veterans fare, you will need to obtain a U.S. Department of Defense and Veterans Affairs or County of San Bernardino Department of Veterans Affairs ID card.

[Do active duty military personnel receive a discount on fare?](#)

Yes. Active duty military personnel ride Omnitrans free when wearing the appropriate uniform at the time of boarding. Active duty personnel also must present a valid U.S. Uniformed Services ID card indicating active service or a Common Access card indicating uniformed services or active duty.

Police and fire personnel also ride Omnitrans free, when wearing a full Class A uniform at the time of boarding.

[Can I use my Veterans fare discount/military free ride on Access ADA Service?](#)

No. Veterans fare and pass discounts and military free rides apply to Omnitrans fixed-route service, OmniGo, and sbX service.
